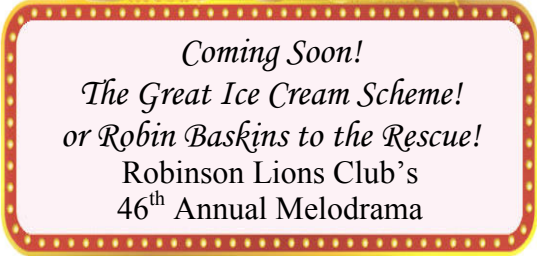
**February 2, First Sunday**
