In the 2014 calendar year the Department logged 55 runs which totaled 281 volunteer man-hours:

- 2—Mutual Aid/Standby
- 24—Medical/EMS Assist Calls
- 4—Structure Fires
- 4—Vehicle Accidents
- 10—Grass Fires
- 1—Storm Spotting
- 6—Monitored Controlled Burns
- 4—Public Assistance
- 1—Cancelled Enroute

97 hours were spent repairing and maintaining equipment in the firehouse.

An additional 562 man-hours were spent continuing the members' commitment to training.

The current roster includes twelve members. The Department has three EMT's and one RN who also donate time to Town and Country EMS. Three members are also on the Brown County Rescue Squad.

In closing, appreciation was expressed to the Robinson City Council for its continued support.

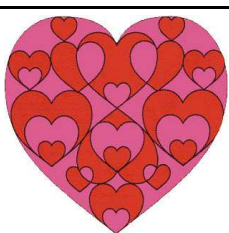

Sometimes there are conflicting appointments or "real job" obligations that must be met with the result being that the volunteers may not be able to serve their shifts. If this is the case, they try to trade shifts or another volunteer just offers to cover the open shift. Also the Board has decided

to change weekday closing time to 7:00 p.m. during the winter since store traffic past this time has been minimal. Using the telephone numbers given at the beginning of this paragraph can allow the Store to be available when needed.
