PLEASE!! OBSERVE THE CITY OF ROBINSON'S SPEED LIMITS

Motorists are reminded that every street in Robinson is covered by speed limits. Signs are posted at both City Limits and on each street in various places. With school now in session, children will be crossing Parsons Street morning and evening: and let's not forget the Bus Stop area on Main Street.

The crosswalk at the intersection of Lincoln and Parsons is painted yellow and yellow pedestrian crossing signs are on both sides of the crosswalk. Vehicles must stop when pedestrians are in the crosswalk. Motorists are reminded that there is a 20 MPH speed limit on Parsons from James Street south to the railroad tracks; and vice versa.

October 6, First Sunday Dinner—

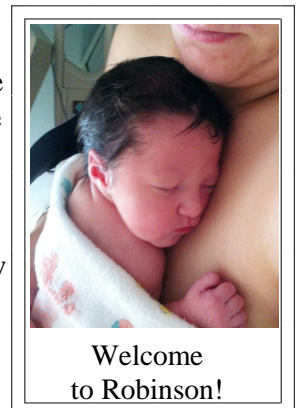
