The BeDunnah Guest House and Collectibles:



The Horton Public Library received a "Literacy and Education in Action Program for Libraries" grant from Better World Books. This was a part of the library's community outreach project titled "We'll Bring the Library to You." Robinson was one of five neighboring cities not having its own library that was chosen. The Little Free Library is a global literacy movement which started in Hudson, WI with anticipation of there being 25,000 of the little structures around the world by the end of the year.

Horton High School students will construct the "Little Libraries" according to the designers' instructions. Robinson residents can look forward to seeing Claire's contribution to this project. Placement has not yet been determined.
