**Editorial Note: Rural life opportunities continue to diminish in various areas,** but we are fortunate to live in Robinson as witnessed and verified during the last several weeks. As you read this issue of *The Robinson Voice*, you may think of it as a “Thank You” edition.

Volunteerism has been rampant in the Robinson area with many people reaching out to help others.

While several of the activities have been cited in the articles, we shall share another here. A youngster recently neglected to talk to his family about his plans for the late afternoon, had come home from school and gone outside. The youngster was not at home when he should have been. Two of the family members started searching for him while one stayed stationed at home. The obvious—homes of other youngsters—were checked without success. The search continued with more neighbors “spreading the word” and others joining. By our count at least 12 individuals were searching—6 of whom ultimately headed toward Wolf River. 45 minutes from when the youngster left the house—considering the youngster’s age (upper elementary) and the number of friends probably too soon for an Amber Alert (but not far off)!—with much relief, the youngster was seen walking down the road, retrieved by a neighbor, and “delivered” home.

In Luke 10:29 Jesus is asked “And who is my neighbor?” In Robinson, the answer to that question is obvious as we all recognize that it takes a village to care about and care for each other.
