From the City of Robinson:

For those planning to run for local positions:

Noon, June 1, 2017 is the deadline to file for an office. Kansas House Bill 2104 moves elections to the fall and also raises the filing fee from \$5.00 to \$20.00. In lieu of the filing fee, a petition may be circulated with 10 signatures being required to run for a city office. Paperwork is **available at the City Hall**, but **must be filed with the County Clerk**. If a Primary Election is needed it will take place on Tuesday, August 1, 2017. The General Election will take place on Tuesday, November 7, 2017.

Changes in Robinson City trash rates: Because of increased rates at the Brown County Transfer Station and the need to maintain city equipment, the trash rate will change from \$16 to \$20 for once-weekly pick up and from \$21 to \$28 for twice-weekly pick up. The last rate increase for trash pick up was in 2015.

The City of Robinson is accepting sealed bids on a Cub Cadet 23 HP ZTR mower. Bids will be accepted until 5 p.m. Monday May 1, 2017. They will be opened at the regular city council meeting that evening. The mower may be seen by contacting city hall.

Residents of Robinson are reminded that all cats and dogs over 6 months old must be registered. Registration is to be renewed during the month of April for each pet each year.
