November 7, 2017 is election day for school board members and for city officials. Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. at the Robinson City Hall Community Room for residents of the City of Robinson and Robinson and Irving townships. This is the first time that school board and city elections are being held in November since the Kansas legislature voted to move them from April to November. Voters are reminded to bring their photo ID and that one may cast a provisional ballot if their registration is uncertain.

Residents of the City of Robinson vote for Mayor and city council members as well as for positions 4, 5, and 6 of the USD 415 board. The following people have filed for office:

Mayor – Mark Lieneman

Three people have filed and will appear on the ballot for the five city council positions.

City Council – Dorothy BeDunnah

City Council – Angie Muckey

City Council – David Taylor

The Kansas Secretary of State reminds voters that, “To vote for a person whose name is not printed on the ballot, write that person’s name on the line provided and darken the oval to the left of the name. Write-In votes are permitted ... when there is no candidate who has filed for the particular office in question.” and “Write-in votes are permitted in all general elections.”

For the USD 415 board, John Wright has filed for position 4, Peter Rosa for position 5, and Keith Erdley for position 6. These three are on the ballot for resi-
