Saturday, March 9—7:00 p.m.



Zion United Methodist Church—Regular Sunday school is at 9:30 a.m., followed by worship service at 10:45 a.m.


Upper Wolf Lutheran Church—Upper Wolf is 4½ miles southeast of Robinson. For church information, the contact person is Denise at (785) 741-3142

2018 Fire Department Summary Report

The members of the Robinson Volunteer Fire Department logged 46 runs in the 2018 calendar year, totaling over 155 man-hours. These calls included:

- 14 – Medical/EMS
- 6 – Structure Fire
- 1 – Injury Accident

- 3 – Controlled Burn
- 2 – Carbon Monoxide
- 2 – Passenger Vehicle Fire
- 8 – Assist invalid/Lift assist
- 1 – Flammable liquid spill
- 1 – Rubbish fire
- 1 – Accident potential-stalled vehicle
- 1 – Funeral escort
- 6 – Cancelled in Route

The department members, who meet monthly for training and business discussion, were pleased to announce Brad Brockhoff as a new addition to the RVFD. They currently have 11 members including 4 EMTs, 1 RN, and 1 LPN. Four members are also part of Brown County Rescue Squad.

In addition to serving the community of Robinson, the department assisted in extinguishing structure fires in Hiawatha.

As always, the Department extended its thanks to the City Council for its continued support.
