American Legion Chooses Girls State Representative—

Annaliese Jeschke, daughter of Craig and Elizabeth Jeschke, has been chosen by Post # 148 of Robinson to attend the 77th annual session of Sunflower Girls State on the Kansas University, Lawrence, KS campus. Sunflower Girls State is sponsored by the American Legion Auxiliary and will take place June 2nd through 7th, 2019. Joining approximately 250 other young women who have just completed their Junior year of high school, Miss Annaliese will “Learn by Doing” the political system involved in the government of Kansas. Beginning at the city level, advancing to county and the state, the girls will register to vote, file nomination papers, conduct political campaigns,

and prepare and present speeches. Katherine Neal, Hutchinson, is the 2018 Governor of Sunflower Girls State and will preside at the sessions. Brevin Armstrong, Hutchinson, is the 2018 Lt. Governor will be assisting.

During the week, speakers on government at the various levels will share their expertise with the girls. They will have the opportunity to ask questions about these individuals’ responsibilities in government. Speakers will include: The Honorable Judge G. Joseph Pierron, Kansas Court of Appeals; Dr. Barbara Ballard, State Representative; Ms. Melissa Burton, Department President of the American Legion Auxiliary; and other state, county and city officials.
