ORDINANCE 289

An ordinance repealing Ordinance #75, prohibiting the discharge or firing of fireworks and other pyrotechnic display. Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Robinson, Kansas as follows:

Section 1. —FIREWORKS PROHIBITED

The discharge, firing or use of firecrackers, Roman candles, or other fireworks or substances designed and intended for pyrotechnic display is hereby prohibited in the City of Recreation Park. The mayor or Council may order the public display of fireworks by qualified individuals. Provided also that such display or displays shall be of such a character and so located, discharged or fired as in the opinion of the Chief of the Fire Department shall not be hazardous to surrounding property or endanger any person or persons.

Section 2.—EXCEPTIONS RELATING TO DISCHARGE OF FIREWORKS

Fireworks may be discharged in the City if such discharge is on private property, with consent of the property owner, as long as it is not hazardous to surrounding property or endangerment to any person or persons.

- A. No fireworks shall be discharged on City streets or property.
- B. All residue shall be picked up by the resident and bagged for trash pick-up.
