Chocolate Popcorn Balls

Ingredients: 1 T coconut oil
1/2 cup popcorn kernels
4 T butter
10 oz. bag of mini marshmallows
1/4 cup cocoa powder

Pop your popcorn kernels with coconut oil on the stovetop. Salt if desired, remove kernels, and set aside. Melt butter in a large stockpot over medium heat. Add the bag of marshmallows to the melted butter, continuously stirring to combine. Remove from heat and stir in cocoa powder well mixed. Fold in popcorn, making sure to coat each popped kernel. This is also when you would add any extra mix ins—examples include chocolate chips, sprinkles, candy corn, etc. Butter your hands and mold mixture into balls. Place finished popcorn balls on greased dish to cool and enjoy!
