We’d like to let everyone know that the City Council has approved three city-wide clean-up dates for this year. **The Spring dates are March 25th thru 28th.** Here’s some good-to-know information about these dates:

- ALL ITEMS MUST BE CURBSIDE
- OKAY TO PUT OUT:
Appliances, Old Furniture, Scrap Metal/Iron, Old Carpet, Wood, & *Tires (there will be a disposal fee of \$2.75 to \$3.75 per tire)
- **NOT OKAY TO PUT OUT:**
Paint Cans/Containers (The Landfill will not allow us to dispose of paint containers at this time.)
