The Robinson Fire Department would like to say a huge thank you to the community for their recent support at their annual roast beef dinner.

They would also like to remind the community that severe weather season is just around the corner. The following is a summary of the of the storm siren protocols in Robinson. Anytime severe weather is in the county, all fire departments are paged out for storm spotting. **Robinson's sirens are only sounded when residents should immediately seek shelter.** Typically this would be rotation spotted moving towards town, or a tornado warning that threatens the immediate area. **The siren will sound for 3 minutes, and repeat if the threat continues. There is NO all clear.**...if the siren is still sounding, residents should remain in their shelters. Also, sirens are designed for outdoor warning only. Don not assume you will hear them inside. Be sure to have multiple sources for weather information such as a NOAA weather radio, FM radio (with batteries incase the electricity goes out), weather apps, etc..
