Robinson School History—The Robinson History Association enjoyed a presentation on all of the past schools within the Robinson township at their March 18 meeting. They shared the photos below depicting (left to right) Diamond School, Robinson Elementary School, and Prairie Springs School. A related news item (shown below) tells the funny history of what happened to Leona's first school, which served some Robinson township students.

"The first school house, near Leona, met with a tragic and unique end. School was taught in it in 1867, and when the fall term of the next year was to begin it was discovered that some enterprising spirit had stolen the house bodily. It was tracked to a point near Padonia, in Brown county, but was never recovered." - Robinson Index
